How to Participate


This stamp collecting is part of the "KOBE OPEN FACTORY" event, where you can explore participating companies. There are a total of 33 stamp collection spots at various factories and satellite venues. You can earn digital stamps by scanning the "NFC tags" or "QR codes" installed at each spot with your smartphone. Enjoy the stamp collecting in your browser, so there's no need to install an app!

Important Information

1.When Reading NFC Tags

Only NFC-compatible smartphones can be used. NFC stands for Near Field Communication, a short-range wireless communication technology jointly developed by Sony and NXP Semiconductors (formerly Philips Semiconductors). It is an internationally recognized standard, allowing data communication by simply holding your smartphone a few centimeters near the NFC tag, enabling stamp collection. *The communication range may vary based on the size of the tag and other factors.*Due to device specifications, NFC-compatible devices must have their screen unlocked to read the tags.

2. When Scanning QR Codes

For iPhone Users (Use Safari)

Please use the standard camera function to scan the QR code. XUsing external QR code scanning apps or widgets will not allow you to collect the stamp.

For Android Users (Use Chrome)

Please use your preferred QR code scanning app to scan the code.

3. While Participating in Stamp Collecting

This stamp collecting activity uses a web browser. Please do not reject your cache or cookies while participating, as this may cause your collected stamps to disappear. Additionally, please avoid using private mode browser.

You can find directions to your destination on your smartphone.

"KAIKOH KOBE" is a region-wide open factory event launched in 2022, designed to showcase the rich craftsmanship and manufacturing excellence of Kobe, Japan. This event provides a unique opportunity for the public to visit the production sites of many manufacturing companies, which are typically not open to the public. Participants can gain an insider's perspective on how products are made, hear firsthand from the artisans about their creative process, and even participate in hands-on experiences in the workshops.

Now in its third year, the event will showcase 33 manufacturing companies, with a special emphasis on the Nagata district of Kobe. Visitors can enjoy self-guided and guided tours, workshops, exhibitions, and even stamp collecting, all designed to highlight the unique appeal of the local manufacturing scene. We invite you to explore a variety of factories and experience the region's vibrant industrial culture.






